Commodity Report— February 2010

We have seen three straight weeks of double digit lumber price increases. Producers are pushing solid two week order files and are now quoting four week delivery times. Orders continue to flow to the mills and show no signs of letting up any time soon. The industry is still puzzled as to where all this wood is going. This week's housing report was negative on year end housing but positive with permits up about 10%. In recent history market rallies rarely last over four weeks. For now the mills are in control and prices remain firm. With limited credit lines, speculation in 2010 will be especially slim.

Western 2 x 4 & 2 x 6 – Reduced availability coupled with a steady flow of orders kept upward pressure on prices. When you did find what you needed it was at a premium price with a two to three week ship time.

Southern Yellow pine 2 x 8 10 & 12 --- Supplies are depleted due to heavy demand, log supply issues and weather. All widths saw double digit price increases. Mills raised prices with little to no resistance. Prices will continue to rise as a result.

OSB --- OSB demand skyrocketed, and prices posted double digit increases. Last week order files moved out to mid February or beyond.

Please stay in close contact with your salesman and check current price and supply conditions on any quotes you may have out. The lumber prices are moving up. Mill closures over the past two years and the housing slow down have created this temporary bull market. This situation won't last but for now plan ahead. We will keep you posted. JAA
